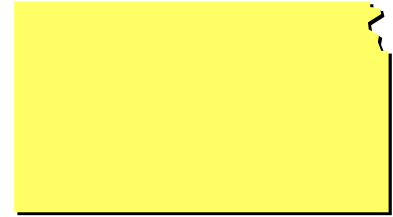

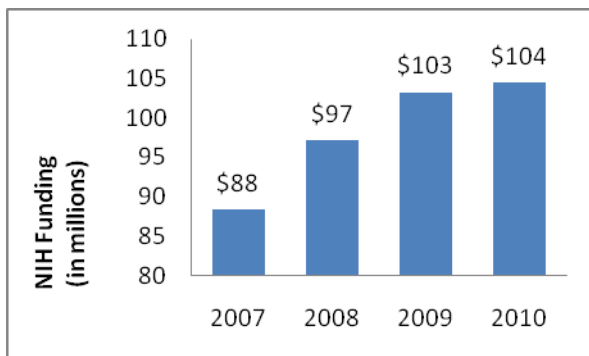


Population State Rank: 33

In 2010, the American Cancer Society estimates that

- **569,490** cancer deaths occurred in the U.S., including **5,370** deaths in Kansas.
- **1,529,560** new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the U.S., including **13,550** cases in Kansas.

Impact on Kansas Economy

On average, in fiscal year 2007, each dollar of NIH funding generated more than twice as much in state economic output. That is, an overall investment of \$22.846 billion from NIH generated a total of \$50.537 billion in new state business activity in the form of increased output of goods and services.

- Business activity generated per dollar of NIH funding in Kansas was **\$2.06**.
- Total new business activity as a result of NIH funding was **\$182 million**.
- NIH grants and contracts created and supported more than **1,558** jobs that generated wages in excess of **\$61 million** in Kansas. The average wage associated with the jobs created was **\$39,435**.

For every dollar the state invests in the University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita, an additional \$1.50 from federal or private funding is spent in Wichita.
