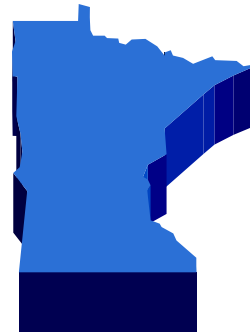

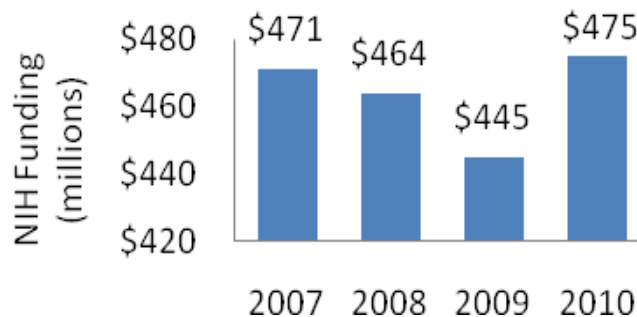

In 2010, the American Cancer Society estimates that

- **569,490** cancer deaths occurred in the U.S., including **9,200** deaths in Minnesota.
- **1,529,560** new cancer cases were diagnosed in the U.S., including **55,660** cases in Minnesota.

Impact on Minnesota Economy

In 2007, NIH funding for Minnesota generated **\$1 billion** of business activity and **7,884** new jobs.

The Association of American Medical Colleges reports that the member medical schools and teaching hospitals in the state had a combined economic impact of **\$8.4 billion** and a total employment impact of **65,430** in 2008.

Minnesota's State Colleges and Universities had a total statewide economic impact of about **\$3.5 billion** in 2005. For every dollar from the state, the system returned **\$10.87**.
