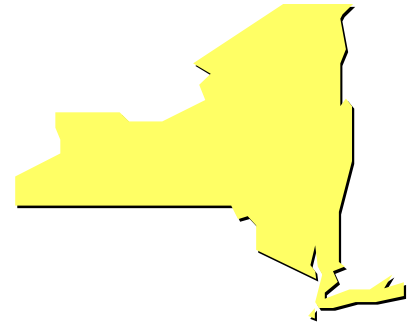

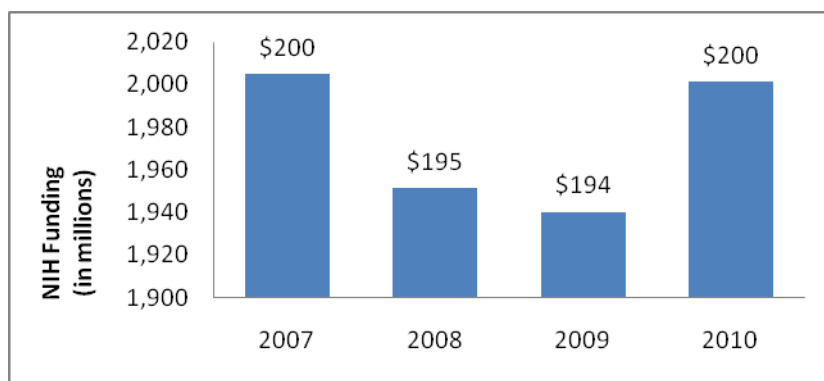

In 2010, the American Cancer Society estimates that

- **569,490** cancer deaths occurred in the U.S., including **34,540** deaths in New York.
- **1,529,560** new cancer cases were diagnosed in the U.S., including **103,340** cases in New York.

Impact on New York Economy

On average, in fiscal year 2007, each dollar of NIH funding generated more than twice as much in state economic output. That is, an overall investment of \$22.846 billion from NIH generated a total of \$50.537 billion in new state business activity in the form of increased output of goods and services.

- Business activity generated per dollar of NIH funding in New York was **\$2.02**.
- Total new business activity as a result of NIH funding was **\$4.051 billion**.
- NIH grants and contracts created and supported more than **27,877** jobs that generated wages in excess of **\$1.243 billion** in New York. The average wage associated with the jobs created was **\$51,054**.

The Association of American Medical Colleges reports that the member medical schools and teaching hospitals in the state had a combined economic impact of \$66.3 billion (ranked 1st in the nation) and a total employment impact of 449,800 in 2005.
