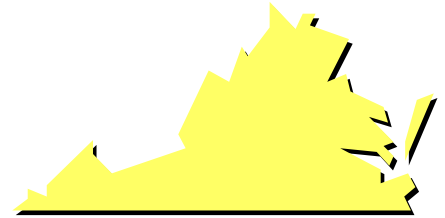

Population: 8,001,024 (2010 Census Estimate)

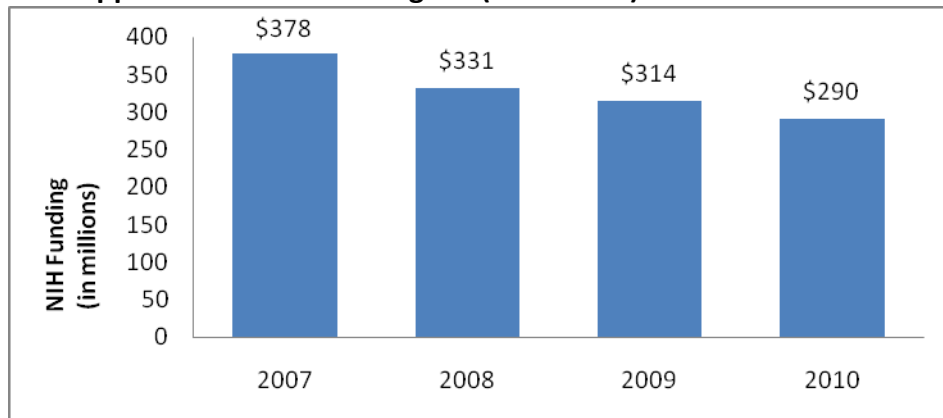

## In 2010, the American Cancer Society estimates that

- **569,490** cancer deaths will occur in the U.S., including **14,230** deaths in Virginia.
- **1,529,560** new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the U.S., including **36,410** cases in Virginia.

## Impact on Virginia Economy

---

On average, in fiscal year 2007, each dollar of NIH funding generated more than twice as much in state economic output. That is, an overall investment of \$22.8 billion from NIH generated a total of \$50.5 billion in new state business activity in the form of increased output of goods and services.

- Business activity generated per dollar of NIH funding in Virginia was **\$2.09**.
- Total new business activity as a result of NIH funding was **\$921 million**.
- NIH grants and contracts created and supported more than **5,720** jobs that generated wages in excess of **\$312 million** in Virginia. The average wage associated with the jobs created was **\$54,514**.

The Association of American Medical Colleges reports that the member medical schools and teaching hospitals in the state had a combined economic impact of \$9.1 billion and a total employment impact of 61,600 in 2005.
