A 72-year-old woman was hospitalized with severe COVID-19 disease, 33 days after the onset of symptoms. She was unable to mount her own immune defense against the SARS-CoV-2 virus because of chronic lymphocytic leukemia. But when physicians at the University of Alabama at Birmingham recommended a single intravenous infusion of convalescent blood plasma from her son-in-law—who had recovered from COVID-19 disease—she showed profound improvement within 48 hours. *Read More*
