AACI Endorses 340B PATIENTS Act



AACI has endorsed HR 7635, the Pharmaceutical Access to Invest in Essential, Needed Treatments & Support Act (340B PATIENTS Act). Introduced in March 2024 by Representative Doris Matsui (D-CA), the legislation aims to protect and strengthen the 340B program via codification of the ability to use contract pharmacies to dispense 340B discounted drugs. This would ensure that 340B patients are able to get their prescriptions at any local pharmacy and that safety-net providers can continue to provide medical and social services in their communities with 340B discount savings. *Read More*
