



AACR-AACI Virtual Hill Day 2022

Meeting Script with Members of Congress and Staff

I'm here on behalf of the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) and the Association of American Cancer Institutes (AACI). Both organizations are committed to using medical research to improve the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of cancer, and ultimately to find cures. Both organizations represent the interests of cancer centers, early-career scientists, research investigators, patients with cancer and survivors.

In 2022, an estimated 1.9 million people will be diagnosed with cancer, and an estimated 600,000 will lose their lives. In addition to this human toll, cancer continues to have a significant impact on the financial security of the United States, with cancer-attributed costs increasing by more than 34 percent between 2015 and 2030 to a cost of more than \$246 billion. We are learning more about how to best prevent, detect, and treat cancers each day, but more research funding is urgently needed to help save lives.

We thank you for providing increased funding for NIH in FY 2022, and we are back again to ask for continued robust funding of NIH and NCI in FY 2023. Specifically, we are asking Congress to:

- Continue to prioritize funding for medical research by providing \$49.048 billion for the NIH in FY 2023, an increase of \$4.1 billion.
- Include at least \$7.766 billion for the National Cancer Institute (NCI) in FY 2023. This request is supported by the NCI's Director's professional judgment budget.
