## **Economic Impact of Research<sup>2</sup>**

- United for Medical Research reports that in Fiscal Year 2021, NIH funded awards totaling \$795.2 million in Florida, supporting 18,284 jobs and \$2.556 billion in economic activity.
- In FY 2021, the biopharmaceutical industry in Florida supported 93,534 jobs and 6,700 businesses.

### Impact of Cancer in Florida<sup>3</sup>

- In 2022, an estimated 1,918,030 new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States. Of these cases, 152,600 will reside in Florida.
- In 2021, an estimated 609,360 Americans will lose their lives to cancer, including 47,540 residents of Florida.

## **NIH FUNDING**

# A Strong National Priority<sup>4</sup>



Congress has increased the NIH budget by \$14.9 billion—more than 49 percent—over the last seven fiscal years. We are advocating for an increase of \$4.1 billion for the NIH in FY 2023.

The Biomedical Research and Development Price Index (BRDPI) measures inflation in the cost of biomedical research. The BRDPI line in the chart above shows the level of NIH funding by year had it kept up with this measure.
