## **Economic Impact of Research<sup>2</sup>**


- United for Medical Research reports that in 2019, NIH funded awards totaling \$59 million in Hawai'i, supporting 1,188 jobs and \$175 million in economic activity.
- In 2019, the biopharmaceutical industry in Hawai'i supported 3,161 jobs and 208 businesses.

### Impact of Cancer in Hawai'i<sup>3</sup>

- In 2020, an estimated 1,806,590 new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States. Of these cases, 6,800 will reside in Hawai'i.
- In 2020, an estimated 606,520 Americans will lose their lives to cancer, including 2,540 residents of Hawai'i.
