IMPACT

Economic Impact of Research²

- United for Medical Research reports that in Fiscal Year 2025, NIH funded awards totaling **\$66.7 million** in Hawai'i, supporting **902 jobs** and **\$188.7 million** in economic activity.
- In FY 2025, the biopharmaceutical industry in Hawai'i supported **3,462 jobs** and **483 businesses**.

Impact of Cancer in Hawai'i³

- In 2026, over 2 million new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States. Of these cases, **9,420** will reside in Hawai'i.
- In 2026, an estimated 626,140 Americans will lose their lives to cancer, including **2,720** residents of Hawai'i.

NIH FUNDING

A Strong National Priority⁴



We are advocating for an increase of \$4.1 billion for the NIH in FY 2027.

The Biomedical Research and Development Price Index (BRDPI) measures inflation in the cost of biomedical research. The BRDPI line in the chart above shows the level of NIH funding by year had it kept up with this measure.
