Economic Impact of Research²

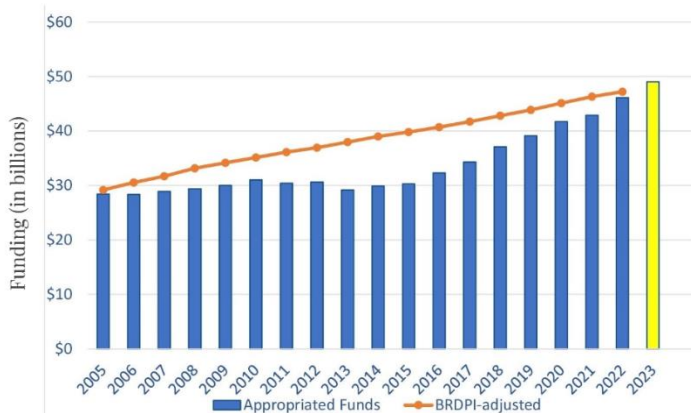
- United for Medical Research reports that in Fiscal Year 2021, NIH funded awards totaling **\$785.7 million** in Missouri, supporting **10,916** jobs and **\$1.883 billion** in economic activity.
- In FY 2021, the biopharmaceutical industry in Missouri supported **31,378** jobs and **1,988** businesses.

Impact of Cancer in Missouri³

- In 2022, an estimated 1,918,030 new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States. Of these cases, **37,480** will reside in Missouri.
- In 2022, an estimated 609,360 Americans will lose their lives to cancer, including **13,050** residents of Missouri.

NIH FUNDING

A Strong National Priority⁴



Congress has increased the NIH budget by \$14.9 billion—more than 49 percent—over the last seven fiscal years. We are advocating for an increase of \$4.1 billion for the NIH in FY 2023.

The Biomedical Research and Development Price Index (BRDPI) measures inflation in the cost of biomedical research. The BRDPI line in the chart above shows the level of NIH funding by year had it kept up with this measure.

Siteman Cancer Center

Siteman Cancer Center, ranked among the top cancer treatment centers by U.S. News & World Report, also is one of only a few to receive the National Cancer Institute's highest rating – “exceptional.” Comprising the cancer research, prevention, and treatment programs of Barnes-Jewish Hospital and Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, Siteman treats 70,000 people every year, including 12,000 newly diagnosed cancer patients, also making it one of the nation's largest cancer centers.
